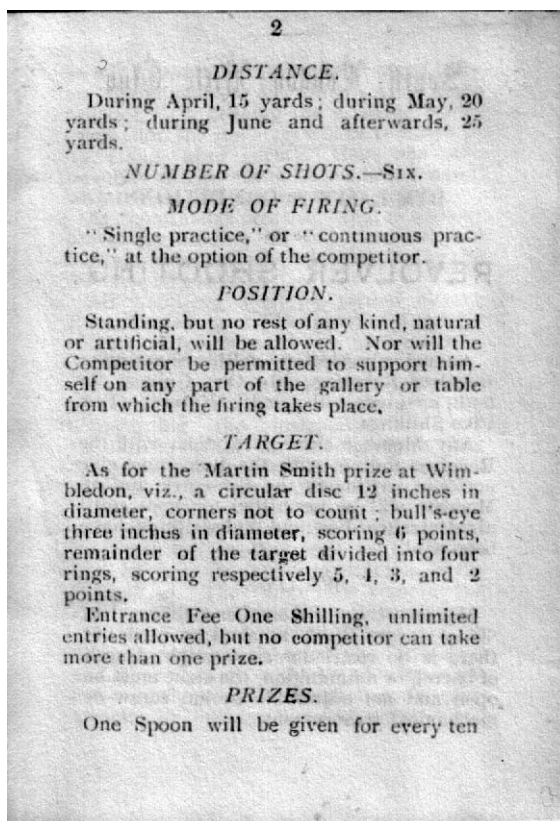
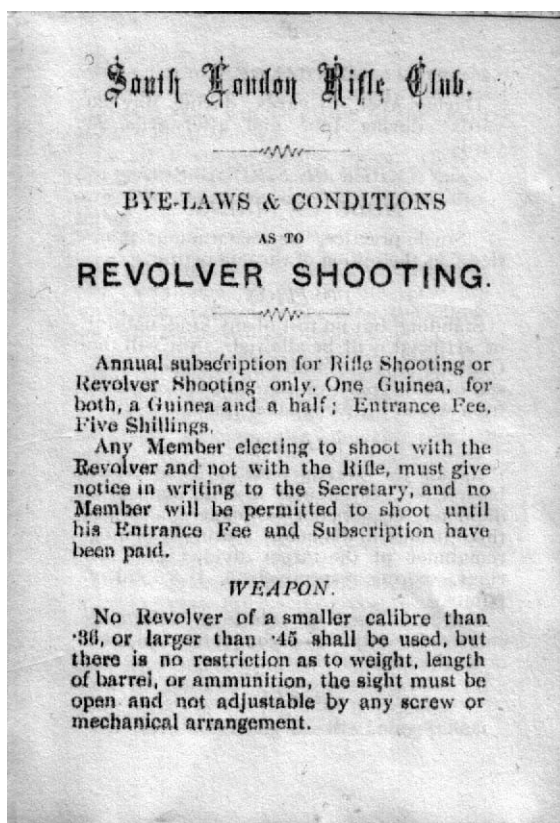

entries, but in the event of there being less than ten entries, three-quarters of the Entrance Fees will be placed to the credit of the highest scorer.

In all Revolver Competitions, winners will be penalised one point for each Spoon won, but not more than six points altogether.

In addition to the ordinary Bye-Laws and Conditions, as far as the same are applicable to Revolver Shooting, the following regulations will be observed:—

No Revolver shall be loaded until the target is ready, and the Competitor has taken his place at the firing point.

The Competitor may load his own Revolver, keeping the muzzle pointed towards the ground or towards the target, unless the Executive Officer or his Deputy or Member of the Committee in charge shall give orders to the contrary, in which case it shall be loaded for the Competitor by some competent person.

On the danger flag being raised, or on the order to "cease fire" being given, the Revolver shall be at once placed in its stand.

Only one Competitor at a time, with the Executive Officer or other person in charge, shall be allowed within the enclosure, all Competitors in waiting must be outside.

On the Competitor's name being called,

he will advance to the Revolver stand, take up the Revolver and fire. At "single practice," *i.e.*, cocking the revolver before every shot, the Revolver will be returned to its stand after every shot, and the Revolver will be cocked while in the stand, with the muzzle pointing to the ground.

At "continuous practice," that is without previously cocking, all the chambers will be fired consecutively, without placing the Revolver in the stand.

All questions shall be settled by the Executive Officer or other persons in charge, subject to reference to the Committee if demanded by the Competitor.

Any member in any way infringing any of the above conditions, or in any way disregarding the instructions of the Executive Officer, or indulging in any dangerous practice, shall be at once suspended from all further practice or competition by the Executive Officer, his Deputy or member of the Committee in charge, and shall not fire another shot on the range until he has obtained the sanction of the Committee. The Committee reserve the right to alter or add to these Regulations.

N.B.—Competitions will be held on Club days, according to the calendar on Tuesdays and Thursdays up to the Wimbledon Meeting, and Tuesdays only afterwards, commencing on Tuesday, the 13th April.
